THE GOD WHO IS

From Pastor Mackay

In his hand is the life of every living thing and the breath of all mankind.

-Job 12:10

Look around you and find an object. Any object will do; big or small, simple or complex. Now begin to answer the question: What had to happen for this object to exist? If you think about it for any time at all, you will find that the answers to that question are almost infinite in number. This tells you that your chosen object is contingent, it is dependent on other things.

Everything in our earthly experience is contingent. Everything with which we interact each day is dependent upon countless causes to exist. For example, the cereal in my morning bowl depends on a farmer growing wheat, a man in the past who started a cereal company, the technology needed to mass-produce the end product, the trucks and drivers to get it to the store, etc. Dependent objects include not just my food, but me as well! Yes, each one of us are dependent on countless states of affairs. We depended on our parents to be born. We depend on food, shelter, and some measure of safety to make it alive through each day. Everything we are familiar with has been caused by something else.

So, what about God? One of God's foundational revelations of his nature shows us that He is independent. He is not dependent on anything. He is caused by nothing, and depends on nothing for his existence to continue.

God reveals this truth about himself in two ways in his revelation to Moses in Exodus 3. First, Moses sees a bush that is burning, but the bush is not being consumed. This theophany (a visible appearance of God) taught a lesson. Normal fire depends on its fuel (and oxygen) to exist. Once the fuel is exhausted, the fire goes out. Not so with the fire Moses saw. In fact, its lack of dependence was the very reason Moses turned aside to look at it. (Exod 3:3). The fire taught a lesson: the God whose presence it represented does not depend on anything for his being.

The second revelation of this great truth comes in God giving his covenant name, which in English we transliterate as "Yahweh." This word centers around the Hebrew for the verb "to be," (hence the translation in our Bibles, "I AM") and as such reveals God's independence. God does not say, "I AM the one who was made long ago," or, "I AM the one who awakened in the ancient times." He does not say, "I AM the one who created the world that it might support my existence," or, "I AM the one who needs you to follow me so I can be God." No, God says, "I AM WHO I AM." God himself is being by nature. The Puritain Stephen Charnock writes that God is saying, "I am the only being, the root of all beings..." and, "at the greatest distance from not being... I am that in every moment which I was, and will be in all moments of time; nothing can be added to me, nothing can be subtracted from me." Similarly, Matthew Henry says, "God is what he is and what he always has been, depending on nothing, needing nothing, and answering to no one."

What does this mean for us? First, this means that we should live humbly. God is unaccountable and self-sufficient. He does as he wants, when he wants, and how he wants (see Psalm 115:3). A.W. Tozer writes that this reality "disquiets" us. We are not comfortable with a sovereign who absolutely does not answer to us in any way, shape, or form. Yet, this is the God we serve. Part of our approach to God must be total humility.

Yet, this humility can be full of rapturous joy, for this God who is untouchable by our greatest fears. What do we fear more than the change that is loss? We fear sickness, relationships lost, and ultimately death. Yet, the God who is cannot be affected by such things at all. In fact, God has given us Jesus, who has exercised by obedience to God the very defeat of death itself. In his love and mercy, God has shown us the way of everlasting life. We must hear the call to trust in this independent God, that we might live.

Isn't it wonderful that a God who is so much mightier than us has given us himself so fully? Let us trust him, treasure him, and seek to love Jesus all the more!




