#### THE DIFFICULTIES OF DIVERSITY

#### From Pastor Mackay

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

For the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, yet one body.

The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." On the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and on those parts of the body that we think less honorable we bestow the greater honor, and our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, which our more presentable parts do not require. But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together. - 1 Cor 12:12-26 Such things should not be! A similar unity has been forged by God among the body of Christ by the Holy Spirit. The common baptism of a common faith has made an inseparable union among believers.

Yet, within this unity there is diversity. Though a body is one thing, it is also many things. We teach our children they do not just have "a body," they have ten fingers, ten toes, two ears, etc; each part brilliantly designed by God to do its work. It is the same in the church. No true, living Christian is disconnected from the body, but at the same time all Christians vary in their gifting. This is good, but our sinful hearts are prone to wander and question God's design. We are prone to two errors.

The first is the challenge of **self-doubt**. We are far too enamored with the opinions of others, thus we often tend to play the comparison game. As a foot desiring to be a hand, so we look to the gifts and functions of other Christians and come to a negative conclusion about ourselves. Maybe one of the following thoughts has gone through your head: "She draws groups of people so effortlessly. I've never been able to do that." "He prays so well. I'm going to keep quiet." "My work at the church during the week is never noticed. I wish I was applauded like that person in front of the crowd on Sundays." There is a rich heritage of self-doubters in the Bible: Moses, Job, Gideon, even Paul himself. They all struggled with their perceived shortcomings. They wish they were gifted differently.

The second challenge is **self-glory**. We are far too enamored with ourselves, and seek ways to avoid those who are less impressive. Here is another diagnostic thought example: "I'm ready to teach a lesson. I wish she would finish praying, already!" If we are intellectually minded, we assume the church should be full of teachers and learners. We may think more practically minded Christians distract from the pursuit of knowledge. On the other hand, if we tend towards compassion and acts of service, we may view theological precision as so much worthless minutiae. If the eggheads would cool it, we could get on helping people!

One common Biblical metaphor for the church is the body of Christ. Utilizing this picture, Paul addresses the Corinthian Christians regarding their tendency toward division.

A body is, by nature, a unified whole. As soon as we think of any body part separated from the whole, we enter the realm of the uncomfortable.

Though they seem different, both of these challenges flow from the same dark place in our heart. We are determining value using worldly metrics, not God's design. How prone we are to determine importance with a self-made ruler. Yet, God has created a unified body. Those parts that often seem to us to be unimportant or secondary are nevertheless vital. You need go no farther than one of our Florida Presbytery meetings in the ARP. It is incredible to see the vast range of strengths and personalities that God has brought together to do Gospel work. The church needs them all! Paul reminds the Corinthians, and mature Christians will agree, that every member of the body is vital to its proper functioning. The more we are tuned-in to that fact, the more we will look to the health of each part, and the stronger the entire body will be.∎

### SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The elders of First Presbyterian Church meet monthly on the fourth Tuesday. The following are highlights from the meeting in August 23.

- The Session continued a study of The Shepherd Leader by Timothy Witmer. The elders have committed to exploring dividing the congregation into "shepherd lists" for better congregational care, and are working toward that goal.
- Needs of the congregation were shared, and a time of prayer was held for the people and ministries of our church.
- Rob Quam, Executive Director of Lake Wales Care Center, and Adell Jahna, Chairman of the LWCC Board, shared LWCC's vision for the use of the apartment building. LWCC interns continue to be housed in the FPC meeting house.
- Stewardship and Finance reported from their August 9 mtg. As of the end of July, YTD giving was • \$542,251 against YTD expenses of \$464,146. The Operating Fund balance was \$271,987.
- Discipleship, Youth, and Children's committees highlighted upcoming programming that will begin in September (see below).
- Missions Committee announced a Bridge Europe visit team that will go to the field Oct 4-12.




