MEET KIM DUNCAN Nursery Coordinator




Hi! My name is Kim Duncan and I am a native Floridian. I am married, have four children and 12 grandchildren.

SPIRITUALS AND GOSPEL SONGS

Many people love Spirituals, and examples that come to mind are Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen, Were You There When They Crucified My Lord, and Lord, I Want to Be A Christian. There is an interesting difference between Spirituals, in that some were born out of slavery and therefore reflect the emotional pathos that is found in persecution and pain. These Spirituals were known as "Black Spirituals" and depend more heavily on the "meaning" of the music that the very simple lyrics are coupled with to express the profound emotional power than on the power of the lyrics. Black Spirituals tend to be Scriptural, contain strong heaven-centered themes and appeal to the Savior for comfort and peace. Some Black Spirituals include: Go Down, Moses, Sometimes I Feel Like a Motherless Child, Were You There, My Lord, What a Mourning, Lord, I Want to Be a Christian and I Want Jesus to Walk with Me.

Other spirituals can be designated as "White Spirituals," which bear some resemblance to Black Spirituals, however they came primarily from white settlers in the south, particularly the Appalachians. The texts were sometimes revised from English sources (Watts, Wesley, Toplady, Newton). Like Black Spirituals, White Spirituals rely heavily on the "meaning" of the music to carry them. Much of the music is similar to folk music from Scotland, Wales, Ireland, and England. They sometimes used shape-notes to help non-readers determine what pitch to sing, similar to the solfeggio system (do, re, mi, fa, etc.) used in Europe. They often had a refrain and used much repetition of words. Some examples of "White Spirituals" include: What Wondrous Love Is This; Let Us Break Bread Together; I Know That My Redeemer Lives-Glory Hallelujah!; and Come Away to the Skies.

Gospel Songs have similarities to both Black and White Spirituals, but tend to have more repetitiveness and are much more likely to be atonement-based, with many references to the

suffering of a sinner. Often gospel songs were written and used in campmeetings, with evangelists like D. L. Moody and Ira Sankey. They were intentionally easy to sing with catchy tunes to attract non-believers. The music was repetitive, unchanging, and uncomplicated. Some examples of Gospel Songs are: To God Be the Glory, Praise Him! Praise Him!; Tell Me the Story of Jesus; I Am Thine, O Lord, I Have Heard Thy Voice; I Am So Glad That Our Father in Heaven; The Light of the World Is Jesus; Dare to Be A Daniel; and Wonderful Words of Life. We are blessed to have such wonderful variety in our songs of praise and worship!∎
