WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO GLORIFY GOD?

From Pastor Mackay

In his magisterial commentary on the Westminster Shorter Catechism, the great 17th century English pastor Thomas Watson begins his reflections by answering this crucial question. Many of us can say the answer to Westminster question #1 by memory, "Man's chief end is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever." But, what does "glorify God" mean? Watson gives four ways.

1. Appreciation. Psalm 97:9. To treat a precious piece of art as we should, we must understand its value. How many tourists have milled through the British Museum or the Louvre, casting their eyes over some of the most remarkable creations of human history, but have known no appreciation due to their lack of knowledge? Watson writes, "We glorify God, when we are God-admirers..." We must regularly consider who God is, growing in understanding and appreciation of his attributes. So, let us think of God often, and do so by the Bible-infused guidance of the Holy Spirit. Let us not think careless thoughts of him, but "search for diamonds in this rock only."

2. Adoration. Psalm 29:2. Our appreciation of God leads us to formal worship of God. The one we appreciate calls us to bring ourselves before him in prayer and praise. God's Word tells us that the saints in glory bring God constant worship in Heaven, and we are able to

join in with them when we gather together. Also, "... this divine worship God is very jealous of; it is the apple of his eye...". God has given us the "how," of worshipping him, which we must earnestly follow. Worship is not something we create, but we respond to God's call according to his guidance. Let us worship him truly!

3. Affection. Deut 6:5. If

we could summarize God's command to his people of all ages, it is that we are to love Him! This is not the selfish love of appreciating only what God can do for us ("This is rather to love God's blessings than to love God."), but loving Him. "This love is exuberant, not a few drops, but a stream." One of the chief ways God disciples us, as we have seen recently in the Gospel of John, is to help turn our attention not to the benefits of knowing Jesus, but to Jesus himself. Do we love him above all else? Do we want nothing more than to see him face to face? Let us live in such a way that is open to God's grace of growing our love for him.

4. Subjection. "This is when we dedicate ourselves to God, and stand ready dressed for his service." Good soldiers take their marching orders from above, but they also cultivate a heart that is eager to follow where their superior leads. So the Christian brings "presents of golden obedience" to God, and therefore glorifies Him. Often we are discouraged by the seeming power of sin in our lives, but let us remember that our Heavenly Father is pleased with those whom he loves when we obey him. Even our halting, unsure, imperfect acts of faith ascend to him as a pleasing aroma through Jesus. So, let us hear our orders and move forth in faith and in confidence.

Watson's words help us to understand that which we so often say: "Glorify God." This summer, consider you and your family's habits. Do you think of God with appreciation? Are you regular in adoring him in corporate worship? Do

you know a growing love for Him (yes, at times confused and strained, but nevertheless growing)? Are you looking to him for your "marching orders" each day? What a God who gives us such help and such abundant grace that we might do what we were created to do: glorify Him.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The elders of First Presbyterian Church meet monthly on the fourth Tuesday (usually). The following are highlights from the meeting in May 23.

- Stewardship and Finance reported that a review of the budget lines and escrow accounts are underway.



During his undergraduate education, Myers became involved with Reformed

University Fellowship (RUF) and with Salem Presbyterian Church (PCA) and other student ministries in which he grew in his interest of theology, the Bible, and Gospel ministry. It was in this context of stewardship and ministry that the Lord called Myers to pursue further theological education so that he would be well equipped to proclaim Christ and His Gospel



from all of Scripture and to be a blessing for God's people through pastoral ministry.

Myers received this education from Westminster Theological Seminary, graduating with his MDiv in May 2023. Myers is now eager and excited to glorify the Lord and to love First Presbyterian Church and Lake Wales with the love of Christ.
